ARE YOU TRYING TO AVOID EVICTION?

***MUST HAVE a written eviction notice with a moveout date within 14 days, AND

***MUST MEET income AND rental amount guidelines for the program, AND

***MUST LIVE in the CVHC service area.

ARE YOU COUCH SURFING, DOUBLED UP OR PAYING FOR A MOTEL ROOM?

MUST MEET ALL the criteria above, PLUS-

***A **referral from an outside agency** such as a school district liaison, showing that the family qualifies as homeless under other federal standards (such as the McKinney-Vento Act). This referral must state that the client will lose their housing within 21 days. This information is used to verify the client's at-risk status. **Being doubled up or living in a motel DOES NOT otherwise qualify as homeless!**

ALSO....

Funding is LIMITED and is first come, first served each month!

Other program rules apply!!
